Level 1	<p>Mainly in Portuguese:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Teaching material and bibliographic resources in a foreign language; ➤ Lectures, classroom discussions and students' presentations in Portuguese, the use of a foreign language in the classroom being acceptable; ➤ Assessment (evaluations and assignments) in Portuguese; the use of a second language is acceptable if previously agreed between the student and the instructor.
Level 2	<p>Good balance between Portuguese and a foreign language.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Teaching material and bibliography resources in a foreign language; ➤ Lectures in a foreign language; both the foreign language and Portuguese are acceptable for classroom discussions and students' presentations, as mediated by the instructor; ➤ Assessment (evaluations and assignments) in Portuguese; the use of a second language is acceptable if previously agreed between student and instructor.
Level 3	<p>Fully in a foreign language.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Teaching material and bibliographic resources in a foreign language; ➤ Lectures, classroom discussions and student presentations in a foreign language; ➤ Assessments (tests and assignments) in a foreign language.

				<p>Biblical Languages 1: Hebrew is a theoretical discipline offered to the first period of the Theology undergraduate course. Throughout it the student learns the basics of Biblical Hebrew, the language in which most of the books of the Old Testament were written. In it, the student has contact with the Hebrew alphabet and the basic elements of the language. In the end, he identifies Hebrew writing; reads selected biblical texts and prayers in Hebrew and manages to translate, with dictionaries, small biblical texts.</p> <p><i>Línguas bíblicas 1: O hebraico é uma disciplina teórica oferecida ao primeiro período do curso de graduação em Teologia. 				The “Applied Behavior Analysis” course is offered to students during the 4th semester of the Psychology program at PUCPR. Over the course, the student analyses the contexts, object of study and applied behavior analysis instruments, as well as assessing the results obtained on the change in behavior. By the end of the course the student will be capable of performing functional analysis of the object of study of applied behavior analysis, utilizing technical language, critical sense and intellectual honesty. <i>A disciplina “Análise do Comportamento Aplicada” é ofertada para os estudantes do quarto período do curso de Psicologia. 				“Political Psychology: Human Rights and their Violations” is an Elective Course intended for students enrolled in the eighth period of the Psychology degree program. Along the course, students will identify Human Rights principles that are relevant for Psychology, historicize the field of Political Psychology, construct consistent arguments in Political Psychology considering violations of Human Rights, and create a research proposal about the subject. By the end of the course, students will be able to conduct research based on Political Psychology concerning phenomena related to Human Rights violations. <i>A disciplina Psicologia Política: Os direitos humanos e suas violações é uma disciplina especial destinada aos estudantes do terceiro período do curso de Psicologia. Ao longo do curso, o estudante identificará princípios dos Direitos Humanos que são relevantes para a Psicologia, historicizará o campo da Psicologia Política, construirá argumentações consistentes em Psicologia Política considerando as violações dos direitos humanos e planejará uma pesquisa científica sobre o assunto. Along the course, students examine historical, institutional and legal aspects of racial and ethnical relations around the world; assess the implications traditional folks’ and other ethnical groups’ ways of being, taking into account the cultural diversity of their regions; and investigate the effects of their ways of being in their

By the end of the course, students will be able to plan psychological interventions for traditional peoples and other ethnic groups' health and quality of life.</p> <p><i>Disciplina eletiva ofertada para os acadêmicos do quarto período do curso de Psicologia.
